RECOGNIZE THE SIGNS

Does the person:

- Appear to be under the control of someone else?
- Not speak for themselves or seem to be coached?
- Lack freedom to come and go at will?
- Have tattoos/branding indicating ownership?
- Appear fearful, timid, submissive, or avoid eye contact?
- Appear disconnected from family, friends and community?
- Have numerous inconsistencies in their story?
- Show signs of mental or physical abuse?
- Avoid social interaction or authority figures/law enforcement?
- Use phrases like 'the life', 'daddy', 'trick', 'track', 'game'?
- Engage in commercial sex acts? (If under 18, any sexual act exchanged for something of value [food, shelter, drugs, money, etc.] is Human Trafficking by Iowa/Federal Law)

All gender/identities can be trafficked & not always by strangers

HEARTBREAKING FACTS

- A person of any gender, race, age and socio-economic status can be a victim, buyer or trafficker.
- Most victims are not kidnapped or held captive physically. Rather, traffickers lie, manipulate and use threats to get and keep their victims.
- Force, fraud and coercion are not always obvious.
- Many agencies in and around Cedar Rapids report serving those victimized by Human Trafficking regularly.
- Many of those victimized never get out of the life.
- Almost 50 million people worldwide were living in a trafficking situation in 2021. (Int'l Labor Org.)
- The National Human Trafficking Hotline receives hundreds of calls about Iowa each year. (Polaris)
- Humán Trafficking has been reported in every county in Iowa...in cities and in rural areas. (Polaris)
- 1 out of every 3 runaway teenagers in lowa is approached for commercial sexual exploitation within 36 hours of leaving home. (Iowa Atty General Office)
